## Contributors

H. RICHARD ARCHER is Librarian, Chapin Library, Williams College, Williamstown, Massachusetts, and formerly was Bibliographer at the William Clark Memorial Library, University of California, Los Angeles 1944-52, and Librarian for R. R. Donnelley and Sons, Chicago 1952-57.

Theodore W. Bossert is Curator of the collection of Botanical Portraits at the Hunt Botanical Library. A graduate of Massachusetts Institute of Technology, and a metallurgist, he was affiliated with Aluminum Company of America for thirty-nine years, retiring in 1962 after four years as Vice President for Research and Development. In his present capacity as a volunteer member of this staff, he has developed the collection of portraiture, together with associated biographical data, to one of many times its original size.

JOHN V. Brindle is Curator of Prints and Exhibits at the Hunt Botanical Library. A graduate in Fine Arts, University of Pittsburgh, he was for many years a curatorial assistant in the Department of Fine Arts, University of Pittsburgh.

Latin lexicography has long been an area of his special interest, and especially that in the major works of Linnaeus. His earlier investigations in biological literature were associated with Linnaeus' entomological studies. ELIZABETH D. KAY is an artist, book collector, plantsman, and student of tropical horticulture and ecology. She served two terms as a Director of the Garden Club of America, and for twenty years was an editor of its Bulletin. She was formerly active in the field of nursing and served on boards of the National Visiting Nurse Association and National Association for Practical Nurse Education. With her husband, Alfred G. Kay, she has recently planned, built, and equipped a teaching center for nature conservation education on a 130-acre tract west of Palm Beach, Florida.

IAN MACPHAIL is Bibliographer on the staff of the Hunt Botanical Library. He is a graduate of the University of Aberdeen in 1949 and the University of London School of Librarianship and Archives in 1955. His two appointments prior to the present were Senior Assistant, Trinity College Library, Dublin 1955-59, and Librarian, United College, Winnipeg, Manitoba 1959-61.

CAROLYN J. STANLEY (Mrs. William R.) is Cataloguer for the Hunt Botanical Library. She obtained her library degree at Emory University, Division of Librarianship, Atlanta, Ga., and has served as Assistant Librarian, Natural Science Library, University of Michigan, Ann Arbor (1958-59), and as Forestry Librarian, Colorado State University, Fort Collins, Colo. 1959-60.
