p. 80, line 4, for 1876, read 1869

p. 83, sub 1902, Jan.

The Haden mango was selected by Capt. Haden and first grown in Coconut Grove, from a mulgoba seedling introduced to Palm Beach from India.

p. 85, sub 1919

Dr. Graham B. Fairchild reports in litt. (4-VI-1964): "... to Panama first in 1921, not 1919, bringing several Wardian cases with mangosteen, mango, and other plants to start Summit Gardens. Some of these were heeled in back of the Tivoli Hotel in Ancon, in the yard of a Mr. Graham. By the time a place was found for them at Summit, labels had been lost, so one mango was called the Graham, another the Fairchild. The latter is what is known as the Cambodiana or Saigon in Florida, and is becoming much appreciated and sought after locally. We came again to Panama in July 1924, being among the first visitors to Barro Colorado Island."
