In 1968 the Hunt Institute acquired the Strandell Collection of Linnaeana from Birger Strandell, a Stockholm physician and a direct descendant of Linnaeus. The collection includes all of the books and papers written and published by the great Swedish naturalist-physician, Carl Linnaeus (1707-1778), in every known edition and translation; it is the largest known assemblage of books and materials about Linnaeus. It includes the only complete set of Linnaeus' doctoral dissertations in their original state, other than that at the University of Uppsala, Sweden, and most of the works written by his students. The collection also contains the majority of works cited by Linnaeus in the first editions of his *Genera plantarum* (1737) and *Species plantarum* (1753). Altogether, it consists of about 2,800 titles of bound volumes, more than 2,000 pamphlets, and 48 albums containing over 4,700 newspaper clippings, from 1831 to the present.

This Symposium celebrates the official opening of the collection.

The Symposium will review the impact of Linnaeus and his work on modern science. Speakers will be:
