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## *Introduction*

With great pleasure we dedicate this catalogue to the memory of Wilfrid Blunt (1901-1987), art historian and author of the classic The art of botanical illustration -- one of the first scholarly surveys of the history of botanical illustration. It is interesting to note that this work preceded by a year Rachel Hunt's exhibition of her books and artworks at the National Gallery of Art. About that same time Blunt made some botanical drawings, to see just how difficult was this genre. We are fortunate to have borrowed one of these, "Galanthus nivalis, Snowdrop" (1948), from his friend and neighbor Jenny Brasier, herself a botanical artist.

Blunt is remembered also as coauthor (with Sandra Raphael) of The illustrated herbal, and for his many introductions and forewords in books about botanical artists. As well, he wrote about a variety of interesting people, and about Middle Eastern travel and stories.

Four years ago I had the privilege of visiting Blunt, then Curator Emeritus of the George Watts Gallery in Compton, near Guildford, through the kindness of Mrs. Brasier. During my time with him -- squeezed in among his many other visitors -- I was able to thank him in person for his recent gift to the Institute of two original paintings of Erica by Franz Bauer, which subsequently were exhibited in "Flora Portrayed: Classics of Botanical Art from the Hunt Institute Collection" and reproduced in an accompanying book. Blunt's knowledge and wit, and his physical stature, though he was then hampered by illness, made a lasting impression.

Blunt was a member of the Institute's Advisory Committee in 1964, when we staged our first International. Others followed in 1968/1969, 1972/1973, 1977/1978 and 1983. The topic of this series might be phrased as "What's new in botanical art?" We continually seek information about, and look forward to presenting, the work of accomplished contemporary botanical artists. Collectively, the catalogues from the earlier shows and this one contain the most extensive record available of 20th-century botanical artists and illustrators; the cumulative index now lists 565 persons from around the world. However, for each artist, the biographical data and exhibition lists are by no means exhaustive. In some cases we have had to select only the highlights from copious data provided to us, whereas in others we have supplemented, as best we could, the very meager information received from artists and lenders.

Commenting on the catalogue of our last International, Blunt wrote, "What a tremendous high standard there now is in botanical illustration!" That certainly remains true and, in order to present as many fine artists as possible, we have limited our selection to one work per artist, with few exceptions. This exhibition contains 97 works by 93 artists. More than half are watercolors, followed in numbers by pen-and-ink and pencil drawings. Among the prints, there are etchings (some with aquatint) and mezzotints. We have borrowed over half the works, enabling us to show many exciting items that we could not acquire. After the full exhibition closes in Pittsburgh, a selection of works from it will circulate around North America as a travel show.

Mr. Blunt had promised to lend us his "Desert Pea" by Paul Jones for this show, but that painting has now been given to the Institute by his estate and in his memory. We are most indebted to Richard Jefferies, Blunt's assistant for 17 years and now his executor, for his kind offer to present this work to the Institute. We are sincerely grateful for this and all the many other donations of artworks that have enhanced our permanent collection so notably over the past five years.




